Our first Bowling Pin match of the year was held on April 2nd. The weather cooperated and gave us just enough sunlight to stay warm and comfortable. We had 17 excited "bowlers" eager to try out the new match design and format.

5 pins were shot off the tables at 10 yards, 20 yards and 30 yards. Scoring was 2pts for knocking a pin down, 2 more points once the pin left the table and 1 point for each round left in the magazine. With rimfire there was a 10round maximum per magazine and for centerfire there were a total of eight rounds in the magazine. We shot two strings at each distance.

3-GUN MATCH 16 april 2022 JOSH WARMAN – MATCH DIRECTOR

On our April 16th 3gun match we decided to try something a bit different and add a rimfire string to the mix. For the pistol there was a dueling tree, and a few steel gongs, then a bit of movement to some steel plates and 3



8 shooters took part in the rimfire match. Mike Clare took third place followed by Josh Warman in second. Dave Ochs won first place. The centerfire string was setup about the same but with less movement. The steel rifle targets were replaced

animal silhouettes. For the rifle there were 2 banks of steel plates, some more animal silhouettes, with a barrier we had to shoot around. The shotgun started off with some clay birds, some movement, then some steel knockdowns, a pop-up clay bird, and a few steel turkeys to finish it off. All movement was done with an empty firearm, with the action open. A minimum of 2 magazines/speed loaders were required for rifle and pistol. with cardboard silhouettes and a few bowling pins.

There were 5 shooters in the centerfire string. Dave Hickerson finished third place. Dave Ochs came in second place. Mike Clare won first place.

The next 3 gun will be July 16th. Some changes in the layout can be expected. We will continue to have the rimfire string as well. I hope to see y'all there.

DEFENSIVE PISTOL 30 APRIL 2022 RICK KLOPP - MATCH DIRECTOR

This was the first Defensive Pistol Match of the year as the previously one was cancelled due to weather. We had nine participants and conducted four stages.

In Stage 1, you are seated at a table discussing the raising interest rates with your banker. While talking with your banker, a group of armed thugs enter and take a hostage. All shots had to be taken from the seated position without hitting your banker or the hostage. Hits on the banker would have resulted in even higher interest rates.

Stage 2 found yourself at the end of the day and just about to lock up your jewelry store. A pick-up truck pulls up with a group of armed robbers. They let two snarling dogs off the back of the truck and start to engage gunfire. You retrieve your counter gun, defend yourself, and try to avoid other pedestrians.

In Stage 3, while stowing groceries in the back of a very small SUV, you're approached by an armed thug wanting your wallet. As you deal with that situation, his friends position themselves behind other vehicles and began to shoot at you. You return fire from the cover of your vehicle and under the rising rear hatch of the SUV.

During Stage 4, you and a buddy travel overseas to help the effort in Ukraine. While serving on an executive protection detail, your buddy is injured during an effort to kidnap the president. While the opposing force has the president in a surrender position, they drag him into a car. You do the best to resolve the situation by taking care of the guys on foot but find yourself out of ammo. Remembering that your buddy's firearms may still be loaded, you retrieve it, shoot out the tires of the car before taking out the driver.

When the smoke cleared, Dave Hickerson took first place followed by Audy James in second place with less than 2 seconds behind Dave. Greg DeMuth took third place following an amazing recovery from his motorcycle accident. The next Defensive Pistol Match is scheduled for 02 July 2022.
