

LEVER ACTION RIFLE SILHOUETTE

JULÝ 9, 2022

MATCH DIRECTOR - JOAN MOODY



The match director calls, relay 1 "bring your equipment to the line", next the call is "ready". During the 30 seconds ready, you load your rifle and

check your site settings. Then after the 30 seconds, the call is "fire". Now you have 2 minutes to shoot 5 rounds, 1 round for each target in the shape of a chicken, pig, turkey, or ram. One shot, one animal down, 2nd shot, another one hits the ground, 3 is the charm, the same with 4 and 5. Now you hear, "cease fire, ground your rifles, make the line safe".

At this point, you have a five in a row pin, can you hit the next 5 to get the coveted 10 in a row, on your way to the NRA honor of a **Grand Slam**. A **Grand Slam** is when you have hit 10 in a row for each of the 4 animals. This is the challenge we face each time we step up to the firing line at a Lever Action Silhouette Match. When the animals fall it is fun. It is not

fun when you pull the trigger and feel you are on target, only to see the target still standing, and swear you can hear the animal laughing at you. If you have not enjoyed the challenge of a Lever Action Silhouette Match, consider giving it a try. We still have 2 more matches this year, August 13 and September 10.

As for the most recent match on July 9^{th} , we only had 8 shooters. The weather forecast was

for thunder storms all day. Experience has taught most of us not to believe the forecast. That morning, we had light rain while Josh, Bill and Keith were setting up the range, but that stopped before we started the match. We did not have another drop all day. For you that believed the weather forecast, we missed you. Remember you can always call the range, and someone can tell you if the guys making the big bucks forecasting the weather are right or wrong.

In the pistol cartridge match, Janet Finnegan won 2nd AA class, Keith McMahan was 1st AA and the match winner was Bill Christine. In the smallbore match, 1st A went to Frank O'Hara, 1st AA was again Keith McMahan, and Josh Warman was match winner.

As for 5 in a row pin, there were several; Bill Christine, Josh Warman, Janet Finnegan, Keith McMahan



DEFENSIVE PISTOL MATCH

JULY 2. 2022

Eleven competitors showed up to participate in four stages at the second Defensive Pistol Match of the year. The weather was perfect until a thunderstorm rolled in at the end and the fourth stage had to be cancelled.

Stage 1 was a warm-up and consisted of the classic El Presidente drill with the added twist of having to shoot around barricades resembling concrete pillars in a public parking deck.

In Stage 2, you found yourself

at the side of a frantic mother whose child had just been abducted by armed perpetrators. Your role was to take care of the immediate situation, move downrange, retrieve the child, and return it to the

safety of its mother. After solving this dilemma, you are at the mother's side when two additional thugs show themselves requiring you to take precision long-range shots.

Stage 3 involved vehicle operations where you were in the




driver's seat of a pickup truck, door closed, and seat belt on. Instructions were given on the best course of action to release a seat belt when exiting a vehicle under extreme conditions. The RSO was then positioned at the passenger window announcing the start of the stage. Upon the signal, you left the vehicle engaging nearby targets. Once surveying the scene, you decide to move forward seeking better cover while conducting a tactical

reload. Additional targets to both your left and right came into view and the shooter had to make decisions on how best to solve the remainder of the stage.



After waiting for the rain to let up, the scores were totaled, and pins awarded to Dave Hickerson for first place followed by Josh Warman in second and Gene Cooley in third. The next Defensive Pistol Class and Match is scheduled for 01 October 2022.

3-GUN MATCH

11 FEBRUARY 2022

The sun was out today, and with the highs in the upper 80s, and no rain it made for а beautiful day for some 3-gun fun. Ten shooters came and shot the rimfire, and we had 9 shooters in the center fire string.



Rimfire pistol had a rail at 15yds with 5 small plates, a rail at 20 yards with 5 not so small plates, also a dueling tree, and a plate actuated swinging silhouette. For a total of 19 targets. The rifle run had a rail at 20 yds with 5 plates. A Texas star with 8 plates at 15 yards, and 6 ram silhouettes spread 25 to 50 yards. For the shotgun run there were 6 knockdowns one with a flying clay, and 7 clays on their perches.

Jerome Schreiber took 3rd place. Dave Hickerson won 2nd place. Mike Clare walked

away with 1st place, and really set the pace for the day.

The centerfire pistol had the same rails, but with 5 plates at 15, and 7 plates at 20, and a dueling tree to clear and the swinging

silhouette. Rifle had 14 paper silhouettes, 3 zombies up close and the rest were spread out to up to 75 yards. The shotgun run didn't change from the rimfire.

Mike Clare won 3rd place, just barely getting by Mike was Jerome Schreiber taking 2nd. Josh Warman won 1st.

Thanks again to all who came and helped set up, tear down, and set targets between shooters. All in all, it was a great day of shooting, and I hope to see you at the next one.

CHATUGE GUN CLUB TRAP GROUP

The Trap group is meeting on the range every 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month, weather permitting. All arrive around 9:30AM to help setup the trap machine, but we can accommodate late arrivals up to around 10:30AM.

Currently, we are operating without squadding (5-person teams) or keeping score. The cost per round of 25 clay birds is \$4.00, which covers the cost of the clays. To shoot you will need to bring your shotgun and ammo, most are shooting 12Ga. Any single

shot, Over/Under, Double-Barrell or Semi-Auto shotgun will work.
