This was the third Defensive Pistol Match of the year and appropriately named "Halls and Walls." The name comes from the Executive Protection world and sure, halls and walls duty is at the bottom of the EP food chain, however one needs to remain attentive at all times. Today was no exception. We had 16 competitors and

conducted three courses of engagement.

Stage consisted 1 of engaging a steel popper which activated a moving target. The shooter had to move to an adjacent wall and engage two new targets in addition to the one in the background. moving Stage 2 allowed the competitor to repeat Stage 1 then conduct a mag change while moving to Stage 2. This stage involved

shooting between two walls with multiple adversaries and hostages present. Stage 3 was a reshoot of Stage 1, the magazine change between Stages 1 and 2, a reshoot of Stage 2, and another mag change as you approached Stage 3. This final location presented a challenge in that the shooter had to engage targets on the left and right side of a long hallway through small openings and included a steel popper at 20 yards on the right side.

> Normally there are only empty halls and blank walls looking at you although our stages today had you thinking and moving. Once the times, and penalties were tallied, Bob Bourke took first place followed by Gene Cooley in second, and A.T. Sorrells in third. A special thanks to John Kremski for helping to set up the event on evening. Friday The next Defensive Pistol Match is scheduled for 07 October 2023

when we will be shooting; weather permitting, one of the hardest law enforcement courses of fire – the Federal Air Marshall Qualification.







July 8 was the 3rd Lever Action Silhouette Match for this year. Thanks to Josh and Katie and others for doing the set up. These matches would not happen if it were not for the folks getting out early to setup the rails and targets. A big thank you goes out to Charlie Meli for making it possible for us to swap out some of our old targets for new ones.

As we do at our Lever Action Silhouette Matches, we started with the Pledge of Allegiance to our Flag. At this match we had 17 shooters, four of which were new to the match. We welcomed, Peggy Sue, Ken, Katie and Marie, hope to see you all at the next one. You all did a fine job and I believe you had fun and that is the goal.

I guess our live turkey has moved on, as we did not see her at all. The only turkeys were the ones still standing at the finish of each of our 3 relays. The weather was hot and humid, but with the on and off breeze and the




help of the fans, we were able to have an enjoyable match. Always a big hug to Bill Christine for making the trip down to the 100yard line to reset rams easier by using his "uber".

Shooting from the range firing line and moving the tables between stages not only provided cover from the sun and rain for shooters and scorers but made for a less confusing and SAFER match which is priority number ONE.

I learned a valuable lesson which is to make sure you have fresh batteries in your optic BEFORE the match because when it dies on the firing line so does your chances of hitting the pins. Thanks to everyone that came out to shoot, Josh for keeping score, Katie for setting up pins (both being an extra set of eyes) and everyone that helped set up, move tables and tear down after the match, it is all greatly appreciated.

Thanks to all who came out for the Match, and for those who could not make it (you know who you are) See you next Month... And a fun time was had by ALL




