BLACK POWDER PISTOL

5 AUGUST 2023

GARY CAINES - MATCH DIRECTOR

We had fantastic weather for the Black Powder Pistol Match on August 5. Bright sunshine and virtually no wind. It was a little warm, but not that bad. There was a lot of smoke from the black powder in the air.

Seven shooters and four observers showed up for the match. Six of the shooters were club members. We shot 10 shots at 25 yards at NMLRA P2 targets and 10 shots at 50 yards at NMLRA P1 targets, all offhand and one hand hold.

We had a mixture of revolvers and single shot muzzle loading percussion pistols. Scoring was by NMLRA rules where the shot center counts toward scoring.

The overall scores were as follows.

- 1 Dan Pressley 153
- 2 Gary Caines 145
- 3 Barry Dean 114-X
- 4 Keith McMahan 106

Several normally high-scoring competitors were shooting newly acquired guns and sone had some technical difficulties, which accounted for some unexpected lower scores. However, the main purpose of the match was to have fun and we did have fun.

Initially we planned on shooting steel silhouette after the paper, but several shooters said they were too tired, so this was dropped from the match.

The match was won by Dan Pressley, with a score of 153, shooting a .45 Thompson Center Patriot Pistol. Dan is also the National Muzzle Loading Rifle Association Field Representative for North Georgia and was visiting us from the Blue Ridge Mountain Men Muzzle Loading Club in Toccoa. Dan also won the previous Black Powder Rifle Match held on June 17.

As soon as we saw Dan's 25-yard target, we knew we were in trouble! Gary Caines came in second place with a score of 145, also shooting a .45 TC Patriot Pistol and Barry Dean finished up in third place with a score of 114-X.

LEVER ACTION RIFLE SILHOUETTE

12 AUGUST 2023

MATCH DIRECTOR - JOAN MOODY



August 12th was a great day for shooting, a tad warm, but it is August. We had 19 shooters, with 3 being first timers. We look forward to them being part of the family.

Lever Action Silhouette is focused toward shooters who enjoy shooting hunting arms. The matches are designed so that a competitor can shoot either or both smallbore or pistol cartridge rifles.

We shoot the pistol cartridge match first before we take time to refresh with lunch. Anyone that would like to shoot their smallbore rifle in the pistol cartridge match is welcome to do that, but because of the lighter round and heavier targets, it is possible for you to ring a target and it not go down, but it is still fun to shoot.

The small-bore rifle can be any lever action, pump or semi-auto rim-fire rifle with a tubular magazine (No

bolt actions rifles), .22 long rifle ammunition, or high power only, hyper velocity ammunition is prohibited.

The center-fire rifle can be any lever action rifle with a tubular magazine. A rimmed pistol cartridge must be used.

Rear sights may be open, receiver, or tang sights, mounted as originally intended. No extended mounts are permitted. The front sights must be a post or bead or a fixed, non-magnified round aperture.

The next lever action match will be on September 9th; at that match we will also shoot pistols in the Hunters Pistol match. You will need a minimum of 40 rounds of ammo for the smallbore, and 40 rounds of ammo for pistol cartridge, in both rifle and pistol matches. Consider the number of extra rounds you may use for practice or sighting in.

WHAT HAPPENED TO MY NEWSLETTER?

The cost of the August newsletter was about \$1.27 each. It runs today, \$0.66 postage and in this case about \$0.61 for printing per newsletter. This came to about \$1,080 total for 733 issues, including the folding, stamping and addressing each one. This also considers that we have about 142 members that have made the choice to "opt out" and not get a mailed copy, only electronic.

We have discussed going to electronic newsletters off and on for the past 15 years. When this discussion began in about 2010, we still had about 30%, give or take, of the membership that either did not have computers, did not have e-mail or did not know how to work either one. According to today's records, I only

show three people out of 875 that we don't have e-mail addresses for.


At the board meeting on Wednesday 16 August, we discussed this again and the board made the decision to eliminate all hard copy or snail mail newsletters and go strictly to electronic distribution except for the April newsletter which the bylaws would require for notification of the annual meeting.

That being said, the August newsletter will be the last one you will receive by US Mail until April 2024. The board did give the president the prerogative to publish a hard copy newsletter when it is felt necessary. This should free up about \$5,000/year for assistance of various worthy recipients or organizations.


