DEFENSIVE PISTOL MATCH

7 OCTOBER 2023

MATCH DIRECTOR – RICK KLOPP





This was the last Defensive Pistol Match of the year and consisted of shooting the legendary Federal Air Marshal Qualification which is commonly known as

'the toughest qualification in federal law enforcement." A fuselage representing the main body of an aircraft was assembled at the range with both first class and economy seating compartments.

The air marshal qualification was shot on three targets set up at seven yards. The target consisted of the standard FBI-Q which is a plain white target

representing a milk bottle with no scoring lines. There were seven drills consisting of a total of 30 shots and a maximum score of 5 points per shot. A score of 135 or better was required to pass. In addition, each drill had a very tight time allotment and a pass/fail score. The maximum combined time

for the seven drills was 33.80 seconds. This type of scoring required a flawless balance between speed and accuracy.

We had 20 participants who attempted the qualification with no one achieving a passing score. The air marshal qualification is considered challenging, even amongst serious shooters, and represents an excellent

standard for legally armed citizens to test themselves against. A special thanks to John Kremski, Dave Hickerson, and Keith McMahan for helping to set up

the range on Friday evening.

We will be embarking on a study of tactics next year at the Defensive Pistol class and matches. The schedule will be posted soon, and I anticipate one class and match per quarter. Until then – stay safe and be dangerous.

In the mornings smallbore match Katie Nelson won 2nd place in B class. John Kremski won 1st place in B class. Josh Warman was the Match Winner.




The afternoon's Pistol Cartridge match had John Kremski take first in B class. Bill Christine took first in A class. Josh Warman was the Match Winner.

BULLSEYE PISTOL

28 OCTOBER 2023

MATCH DIRECTOR - THAD BYNUM



On October 28th we had the first Pistol bullseye match at the club in recent years. As

the match director I have to admit that I had never run, shot or even seen a pistol bullseye match when I agreed to run this one. The match is designed to be run with a combination of 3 guns: a 22 rimfire, a centerfire 32 caliber and above and a 45.

A complete match would involve shooting 90 rounds with each with a

total potential score of 2700. It involves shooting a combination of slow fire which is 10 rounds in 10 minutes, timed fire which is 2 strings of 5 rounds in 20 seconds for each string and

rapid fire which consists of 2 5 shot strings in 10 seconds each.

We did an abbreviated course of fire and only shot 30 rounds with each gun with a total potential score of 900 points. Josh Warman won 1st place in the

rimfire round with a score of 256. 2nd place was Keith McMahan with a score of 237 and 3rd Place was Joan Moody with a score of 231.

In the centerfire round we had Josh Warman 1st place with a score of 237, Matt Brewer 2nd

place with a 224 and Keith McMahan 3rd place with a score of 213.

The third class was 45 in which Josh Warman won 1st place with a score of 224, Matt Brewer 2nd place with a 188 and Thad Bynum 3rd with a 153.

Special thanks to Ed Jones for assisting with the range commands which enable me to be able to shoot.

Another note, those that did not have the appropriate guns for the three rounds were allowed to shoot all three but only the guns within the correct classification were scored.

In other words, if a person shot a 22 rimfire in the 45 class we didn't include in the 45 classifications for scoring.

It is my understanding that Robert Collins will be running this match next

year, so I encourage all to show up and try your hand at it!
